

Call to Worship

- L: Jesus said, "Come unto me all you who labor and are heavy laden and I will give you rest." And so, we invite each of you to this time of peaceful worship. Flee for a while from your tasks:
- C: Hide yourself for a little while from the turmoil of your thoughts.
- L: Come, cast aside your burdensome cares and put aside your laborious pursuits.
- C: Come, give your time to God, and rest in him for a while.

A Liturgy of Remembering (Using the Advent Wreath Candles)

L: This first candle we light to remember those whom we have loved and lost.

(Pause while the first candle is lit.)

- L: We pause to remember their name, their face, their voice, the memory that binds them to us in this season.
- C: May God's eternal love surround them.
- L: This second candle we light is to redeem the pain of loss; the loss of relationships, the loss of jobs, the loss of health.

(Pause while the second candle is lit.)

- L: We pause to gather up the pain of the past and offer it to God, asking that from God's hands we receive the gift of peace.
- C: Refresh, restore, renew us O God, and lead us into your future.

L: This third candle we light is to remember ourselves this Christmas time. We pause and remember these past weeks and month; the disbelief, the anger, the down times, the poignancy of reminiscing, the hugs and handshakes of family and friends, all those who stood with us.

(Pause while the third candle is lit.)

- **L:** We give thanks for all the support we have known.
- C: Let us remember that dawn defeats darkness.
- L: This fourth candle is lit to remember our faith and the gift of hope which the Christmas story offers to us.

(Pause while the fourth candle is lit.)

- L: We remember that God who shares our life promises us a place and time of no more pain and suffering.
- C: Let us remember the one who shows the way, who brings the truth and who bears the light.
