## Tim's Time—Lay Leader Thoughts

## Love That Perseveres: A Reflection for February

February brings to mind love—Valentine's Day reminds us of the deep affection we share with family, friends, and those we cherish. But love is more than just romance; it is the foundation of how we are called to live as followers of Christ. The Apostle Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 13:4-7 (NRSV): "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things."

This kind of love is the same love we are called to extend beyond our close relationships—love that perseveres through hardship, love that works for justice, love that reaches across divisions.

February being Black History Month, is a time to honor those who have fought for justice and equality, often through incredible hardship. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., inspired by Christ's love, lived out the words of Micah 6:8 (NRSV): "He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

To love as Christ loves means to seek justice, to show kindness, and to walk in humility. It means meeting every person not with fear or suspicion, but with the same warmth we show to those we love most. It means listening, learning, and working together to make the world reflect God's kingdom.

The weather has not been in our favor as to our roof replacement, but we trust that in time, it will happen. This waiting reminds us of another call to perseverance:

Galatians 6:9 (NRSV) says, "So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up."

We are not just waiting for a roof—we are continuing to serve, to love, to reach out to our community. Whether through our Monday night meal, our food pantry, or our worship together, we are called to keep doing good, even when progress seems slow.

This month, let us love boldly, work for justice humbly, and persevere with faith. Just as love endures, so will we.
